

Southern Indiana Region Fun Autocross October 6th, 2024






How was the MirrorCross? Who did an outstanding job?

Event Results

Fun Autocross & MirrorCross - by Paul Dornburg

Our last autocross event was a fun event which included an autocross and a MirrorCross. What is a MirrorCross? It's when 2 cars line up on opposite sides of the autocross course and make one lap to see who can do it the quickest. Using times from the fun autocross that preceded the MirrorCross, drivers were handicapped and started at different times.

I was worried about the slim turnout of 22 drivers but that turned out to be about the right number of competitors. The Toyota manufacturing group brought 5 drivers for their Supra. I thought that having so many drivers in one car might be a problem, but their times were so diverse they didn't end up running against each other. Don Beaman brought a Fiat 124 Spyder that was quite different than his usual Mustang. We'll hear more about Don later. I drove Terry's 911 because I drove my truck so there'd for sure be a vehicle to move the timing trailer. Everyone else was in a car they were somewhat familiar with.

We started off with a normal autocross to establish a qualifying or base time for each driver. The course was around the perimeter of the site running counterclockwise. Drivers got at least 5 tries at the course while the people who had earned bonus runs got to use the extra runs. You can see the course on page one. I took the quickest time for each driver and put it in a spreadsheet arranged from slowest to quickest.

The Challenge portion of the event would pair the 2 slowest drivers against each other with the driver winning the best of 3 runs moving on. Slower drivers would get a timed head start. For example, the first 2 drivers were Larry Pearsall in his Mustang and Bill Wheelock in an MR2. Larry got a 6 second head start each time. Larry lost the 1st run because of some confusion on his part but performed well winning the 2nd round but losing the 3rd one. The 2nd contest saw Bill beat Bob Sonntag in his Genesis GV80, 2 runs to 1. That put Bill up against his son David but they were both in the same car, so we skipped David for that round and Bill ran Don Beaman. Don beat Bill 2 runs to 1. Now the Wheelock MR2 was freed up for David to use. Don beat David in 2 runs as David coned each time.

Next up was Don vs. Michael Condiff in his 350Z. Don beat Michael on 2 consecutive runs. Next up was Don vs. Jayce Boyce in the Toyota Mfg. Supra. Don won the 1st run, Jace won the 2nd run, and Don won the 3rd run but just barely. Now Don moved on the run Cameron Davis in his Fiesta. Don won 2 runs to 0.

By now we were beginning to see that Don was getting more and more familiar with the Fiat and looked to be a threat to take the overall win. He beat Terry Davis in his 911 2 runs to 0. Then he took down Kevin Rector in his 350Z 2 to 0. The next victim was Cade Harris in the Toyota Mfg. Supra who also fell 2 to 0. Gregory Stewart in the Toyota Mfg. Supra was up next but he fared no better than others losing 2 to 0 to Don and his red rocket. Max Dittman in the Toyota Mfg. Supra was the next 2 to 0 loser as was Steve Backer in his FR-S. Ernie Roales was Don's next competitor. Ernie spun on his first run which added a little excitement before he lost the next run. Now it was brother against brother as Don lined up against Barry who was in his Supra. Don won 2 to 0 after Barry coned his first run. Joel Wasser in his Honda Civic was the

next victim losing 2 to 0. Now I am up in Terry's 911. I coned on my first run but so did Don, but he beat me by a hair. I coned on my second run and Don did not, so he advanced. Jarrod Davis was the next competitor in his 350Z and he too fell to Don, 2 to 0. The last competitor to take on Don was James Nichols in the Toyota MFG. Supra. Don won the first round, then James clipped a cone on the 2nd round and Don won. Don Beaman took down 15 competitors in 31 runs to earn the grand prize, free entry to the event.

We concluded the afternoon with some call out challenges which you can read about below. All in all I'd say the event was a success and we should do another one in the future.

I couldn't have asked for a better day to run the World-Famous Ice Cream Rally. A clear blue sky calmed my fears about a thunderstorm that could severely impact the running of the event. Some of the course runs through the lowest areas in southeast Daviess county and flooded roads are always a concern when storms are threatening.

Five entries in A class and 6 entries in B class meant there would be good competition especially for the club rally points and the Berry trophy. I went through each route instruction stressing the ones that could be difficult. I especially stressed the multiple route instructions that occurred in a very short period of time, less than a minute. It was a U-turn in a triangular intersection and it gave some teams fits.

This year the starting location was the Lic's Ice Cream and Sandwich Shop in Owensboro. Teams would depart heading west to the US60 bypass which would take them to the east side of town to the Dairy Queen where we have started in the past. Using some familiar roads and some new roads the teams covered right at 100 miles over the course of 2 and a half hours or more if you got off course.

In the end there were some very good scores. Bob Sonntag and Terry Davis had 4 zeros for a total score of 15 and their highest score at a checkpoint was just 6. They also had 4 scores of 1. Just seconds behind also with 4 zeroes was the team of Harold and Karen Davis with 26 and a highest score of 9. Team Lehrschall had trouble with the U-Turn and called for help. The resulting "call for help" penalty ruined what would have been an otherwise decent score of 46. Dave and Suellyn had 2 zeros and a couple of 1's en route to a third-place finish in the A class. Fourth in A was the team of Perry and Karen Young from St. Louis. They are new to rallying and are doing rally events for the experience. Had they not missed checkpoint 7 they would have had a very good score for a novice team. George and Cindy Lewis competed in their first rally and made their way to the ice cream social at the end of the rally having missed the last 3 checkpoints.

In the 6 car B class Ernie and Sue Roales prevailed with a very nice score of 55 which included 1 zero and one 1. Jr. and Josie Crowe were a scant 8 seconds behind team Roales with a score of 63 which included 3 zeroes and a 1. Not far behind the Crowes were Team Wilkins with a score of 84. They didn't have any zeroes but they did score a 1 on the last leg. Jim Cannon and Dawn Sturgeon had a problem with the third leg and ended up in fourth place with a score of 263. They did have a score of 1 on the last leg. The new team of Larry Pearsall and my usual rally navigator Kyle Knott had some issues and missed some checkpoints to finish fifth. Another father/daughter team of Morgan and Jeff Metz finished their first rally together and were 6th in B class. They had a low score of 11 on the last rally leg.

Preparations for the 2025 ICR are already underway.

Deja Boo! Review - by Bob Sonntag

I'd let creating the sixth event of our seven-event rally championship season slide. I needed to knock out a good rally quickly. It was due in under three weeks by the time I really got started. Consulting my archive of previous rallies (and who'd run them...as old rallies not run before are new to the entrant), I borrowed from my 2000s, teens, and some more recent Henderson, Spotsville, & to Owensboro area rallies. The Dornburg "World-Famous Ice Cream Rally" had reminded me of how nice, twisty, hilly, and fun the roads of in Kentucky can be.

I evolved those previous routes into what I thought was a good, fun, and not too hard rally. The route might seem familiar to those with recent experience with rallies in the area and be a fresh take for all. Protection by Stop/Yield, Left at T, and Straight as Possible would rule the day.

I think trick-or-treat might have become the theme for the day. I was hoping for a déjà vu feeling by triggering old rally memories with a route that repeated what used to be frequently used roads and looping on itself to reinforce memories or confuse those with fresh new ones.

Who else can remember Gary Heck working a rural checkpoint in a lawn chair, with a cold drink, with a stopwatch, and with a fair-sized TV so he could watch his football team play?

Not a trick & certainly not a treat: Team Lehrschall looked good-to-go at the start. They did not trip the start control. They returned, rebooted, reset, restarted, resumed without incident. That restart was a treat for them...just like their first checkpoint score. A zero. Hot dang! Now that's a real treat! A great second start to a rally. (Spoiler: They would later trick themselves.)

"Deja Boo!" started from Hardee's on Boeke Road in Evansville. A left, then a another left <u>after</u> a sign reading in part "WESSLEMAN PARK" (not AT, but AFTER), would take entrants into what would look familiar to many as a Roberts Stadium parking entrance. The street name was given. The mileage was given. The description said it would be parking lot-ish. Some turned early??

How many SIR members can remember spending time in those parking lots? The route would then cruise by where we held November/ December fun autocrosses until the lot would no longer support an event. A closed road sign -- have to use it while it's there -- and the new right-turn-only traffic pattern at Vann Avenue would start teams on their way to Henderson.

Calling on a past Bootz/Goebel "Up Front & Straight Forward" experience with a very low CAST, entrants took a CAST 18 tour through Baskett, Kentucky, where they would need to follow the Protection at a couple of intersections or pay a price. At CAST 18, there is think time. Not enough. Just two cars were early. Everyone else was late. Based on the short leg, some were significantly late. It was to have been 8:34 minutes for 2.58 miles checkpoint to checkpoint. (There was some time & distance at 35, so don't be thinking I goofed the math.)

The day was a treat with great weather. Two of three convertibles ran tops down. From the first observation point, top-up was the way to go. Team Wilkins (orange Miata) and Team Hurm (black MGA) somehow converted a "Left at Stop – CAST 55" into a "Straight at Stop" which would eventually T them into a dead end after some twisty roads that won't take a CAST 55. Not a trick written into the rally, but one they experienced. They found their way back to the route. A treat. Meanwhile Team Roales rolled on top up and issue free...for a while.

The route crossed the Spotsville bridge to wander towards KY-3236 (Innovative Way) that does the circular drive thing in front of a Kimberly-Clark plant. Combined with a right at Stop, a couple of main road rule Left at Ts, and parts of four recent rallies teams would be turned around and headed back to the Spotsville bridge for the second of two expected crossings.

It's a nice bridge. MUCH nicer & four times the width of the old bridge. It's so nice that some teams crossed it four or more times. Were the extra crossings a treat? For sure, needing to cross the bridge only twice was the trick.

When headed west, KY-1078 pops in at the end of the bridge. This is the same turn but in the opposite direction where the two convertibles went wro, uh -- "differently" -- earlier in the route. I warned everyone that 1078 appears at the last moment. Assistant Rallymaster Terry Davis and I were watching teams in the Richta app and teams did the expected turn ONTO 1078. Cool.

We would then watch those teams follow 1078 back through Baskett and out ONTO US-60 for less than a mile as 1078 then bears to the right off US-60. D'oh!! Now, that was a trick in the route! A trick that was a problem for teams Roales, Wilkins, and Davis. KY-1078 does another road-goes-right-road-goes-left thing around the Zion Baptist Church...but only if one remembered ONTO topped the Left at T main road rule.

There was a double visit to the Niagara Food Market in Niagara, KY (birthplace of Grandpa Jones) for a DIY bio-break in free zones. My diagram of the ins and outs and corresponding route instructions worked perfectly. I expected at least one team to forget the route instruction being worked and have an adventure in a free zone unless they really worked to trip wrong restart. I don't think anyone did…but Team Sturgeon/Cannon may have something to confess. That's a bit of a surprise because Jim Cannon is one that's been through that area on quite a few of my routes. Oh Jim?

Eventually all but two teams made the post-route social and all those that did were smiling. A treat. A couple of teams looked tired. I sure hope it was a good tired 'cause I know it was a fun route...but it's more fun when ONTO doesn't bite; but, just leads to "you missed that?" smiles.

Those that completed the route have now run KY-1078 from beginning to end – not just the middle part that used to be a classic SIR illustration of ONTO. The other best example being where it with

As I asked about sections of the rally, the Protection intersections in Baskett didn't trip anyone up. Good. Team Crowe got through it on luck. That works too. The other spot I thought Protection would be overlooked (just prior to Ckpt #4) was a non-issue. Well done teams!

Team Crowe was best of all with a 483 and for *yet another dang* event with Class B bettering the best of A.

Class A had the makings of a good battle. Team Lehrschall started with a that zero & had 11 points on Team Davis through the first three controls. Then things when goofy for Team Lehrschall. Team Davis had ONTO issues maxing them at Ckpt #5 and a button issue closing the app at Ckpt #8...which they resolved...but not without learning I'd used directional checkpoints and needed another pass to by the lighthouse to get a score.

Team Roales finished second on B. Team Sturgeon/Cannon third. Both teams maxed one control and used generous doses of TA. Team Roales used 5 for a total 39:30. Team Sturgeon/Cannon were a less frequent but bigger TA user with just 3 accounting for 41:30.
