# Winter Activities:

We'd like to do a 3-event sim-racing challenge. Fastest Lap in Evansville has state of the art, motion simulator rigs. I've always wanted to do something more in the offseason months of December to April, and I believe this is a great place to do so. The preferred dates would be the same as Cars N' Coffee events in Evansville, as those car shows start at 9am. Fastest Lap opens at noon, and it would be pretty easy for some of our Cars N' Coffee participating members to swing by and get some seat time in while having some fun with other club members. Dates would be January 5th, February 2nd, and March 2nd. Fastest Lap has a very easy registration/booking system on their website, and members would be encouraged to sign up and book an allotted time between 12pm and 1pm. You only pay for the minutes you use the sim rigs, not the booked time, so they don't charge until you're on location. Plan to book a 1-hour slot, and if you don't use it all, that's fine. They currently have 4 sim rigs active, with another 4 available (Total of 8) in the very near future. This should accommodate us very well in a less than 2-to-3-hour window. I would like to ask anyone that signs up to let me know they are attending as well. As the challenge goes, we would all be on the same track, same car/class for at least the first 2 events, and would be able to set lap times to compare with others, very similar to how our autocrosses function. iRacing will be the preferred simulator, although they do have Assetto Corsa available as well. Perhaps for the 3rd event we could do an actual full-on race with warmup, qualifying, and a 30-minute race.

Tracks and car selection will be determined later, but I'm very much leaning towards the most beginner friendly, to sim-racing, cars on the iRacing service, such as the GR86 cup car or club spec Mazda MX5, and smaller American tracks such as Laguna Seca, Watkins Glen, Sebring International, Virginia International Raceway, etc.
